WORKSHOP DESCRIPTION:

Indiana Psychological Association is proud to introduce a workshop to Southern Indiana. This workshop will address two issues impacting clinical practice for mental health professionals.

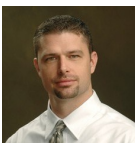
The first presentation will provide a big picture overview of the changes to the DSM-5. This will include broad changes to the manual itself, highlighting major changes to existing disorders and the addition of new disorders.

The second presentation will provide empirical evidence and ethics related to violence risk assessment, as well as risk factors for violence, appraisal instruments, and an integrated-actuarial approach to risk assessment and management.

WORKSHOP PRESENTERS:



Susan South, PhD, is an Assistant Professor of Clinical Psychology in the Department of Psychological Sciences at Purdue University. Dr. South's research investigates the links between marriage and personality and psychopathology. She has published over 30 peer-reviewed empirical publications on the assessment of marital satisfaction, the links between mental illness and marital distress, and the gene-environment interplay between marital dysfunction and mental illness. Prior to her current position, she completed a T-32 postdoctoral fellowship, "Neurobehavioral Aspects of Personality and Psychopathology" at the University of Minnesota. She received her undergraduate and graduate degrees from the University of Virginia and completed her clinical internship at the Medical University of South Carolina. Dr. South was a recipient of an F-31 grant from the National Institute of Mental Health, a grant from the Society for a Science of Clinical Psychology (APA Division 12), and a Kinley Trust Grant from Purdue University.



Sean Samuels, PsyD, received his doctorate in Clinical Psychology from Pacific University in Forest Grove, Oregon followed by a Master of Legal Studies from the University of Nebraska College of Law in Lincoln, Nebraska. Dr. Samuels specializes in the provision of forensic assessment services including parental competency, violence risk assessment, sexual offender risk assessment, mental status at the time of the offense, criminal competencies (e.g. competency to stand trial, testamentary capacity), malingering and psychopathy. He also provides a wide array of psychological and neuropsychological assessments. Dr. Samuels is currently employed at Luzio & Associates Behavioral Services in Evansville, Indiana.
